John 16:12-16



May the Holy Spirit guide our hearts and minds as Pastor Kristen shares today's lesson.




It was a relatively cool day for September. A bit windy I suppose. I ran over to the hospital again, new in my position at Crossroads, knowing that I could get to the hospital in a little under 20 minutes. When I visited with Fred earlier in the day his bible study group was just leaving.

Fred attended Crossroads on Sunday morning, but throughout the week, he found ways to fill himself with God's word. He couldn't get enough! It was a happy, talkative group of men – smiles from ear to ear, just vibrant! "Holy ground, Padre, Holy ground!", said one as he passed me in the doorway.



Fred smiled. "You're back!" He had been given the news earlier in the day that the cancer had massively spread. It wasn't pneumonia. I sat with him and just held his hand for a while before he spoke again, "Do you know the best thing? I get to tell everyone how much I love them!" I wondered if he understood how short his time was. "Don't look so worried for me," he said, "I'm putting on a new robe. I have walked with the Holy Spirit in this life, and He has blessed me... and now I get to see Him face to face!"



Fred knew his scriptures. He knew some important things about the Holy Spirit. He knew:

- 1. That Jesus promised that after he left the earth, he would send the Holy Spirit.
- 2. That the Holy Spirit is a person. Not an "it."
 - A. Knowledge the ability to know, understand & recognize.
 - B. Will an ability to make choices & decisions.
 - C. Emotion an ability to feel, both to have & express feelings & to be aware of them.

3. That having a very intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the power that only the Holy Spirit gives. This is a supernatural power. This is a power that surpasses anything that comes at us in this life.

4. He knew how to have that intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit. How to walk continually in God's holy presence.



Fred was not afraid. And he smiled at the peace he was feeling. When we can face the most frightening of scenarios, in Fred's case; death, with peace and joy, and without fear, I would call that superhuman capability.

I know there are some who look at Christians who are completely at peace, and think that they are brainwashed or delusional. But I know otherwise.

As Christians, we tend to be more comfortable in the very tangible image of Jesus as a human being. Or God, as depicted in art. But what about the Holy Spirit? We begin to get nervous when people pull out words like supernatural, superhuman, ghost, spirit, but this is what God is! The Holy Spirit is God. It's the part of God that dwells in every believer and causes miracles to happen.




Acts 2

The scripture that inspired Fred and filled him with the Holy Spirit is that same scripture that for over 2,000 years filled others and propelled them beyond their human capabilities.


Some have said that the difference in their life is that before, they were walking clay. But after being filled with the Holy Spirit, they became alive. Their eyes and hearts and minds were opened.



Think about some of the incredible bravery and spirit we've seen throughout history. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. What drove him? What set this man on fire and gave him the courage and peace to change the course of history? In 1968, King delivered what would later be known as his final speech, "I've been to the mountaintop" in Memphis, Tennessee. The very next day, at the age of 39, Dr. King was assassinated while on the balcony of his hotel room. His last words spoken were to his long-time friend and musician Ben Branch, "Ben, make sure you play 'take my hand, precious lord' in the meeting tonight. Play it real pretty."

When most people think of Rockefeller, they think of him as a wealthy businessman and the co-founder of Standard Oil, which dominated the oil industry during the late 1800s. What most people might not realize is that he was a faithful Baptist and generous one too.

Rockefeller was a faithful tither and went above and beyond the 10 percent threshold, giving money to churches and also gave money to help buy the freedom of slaves.


